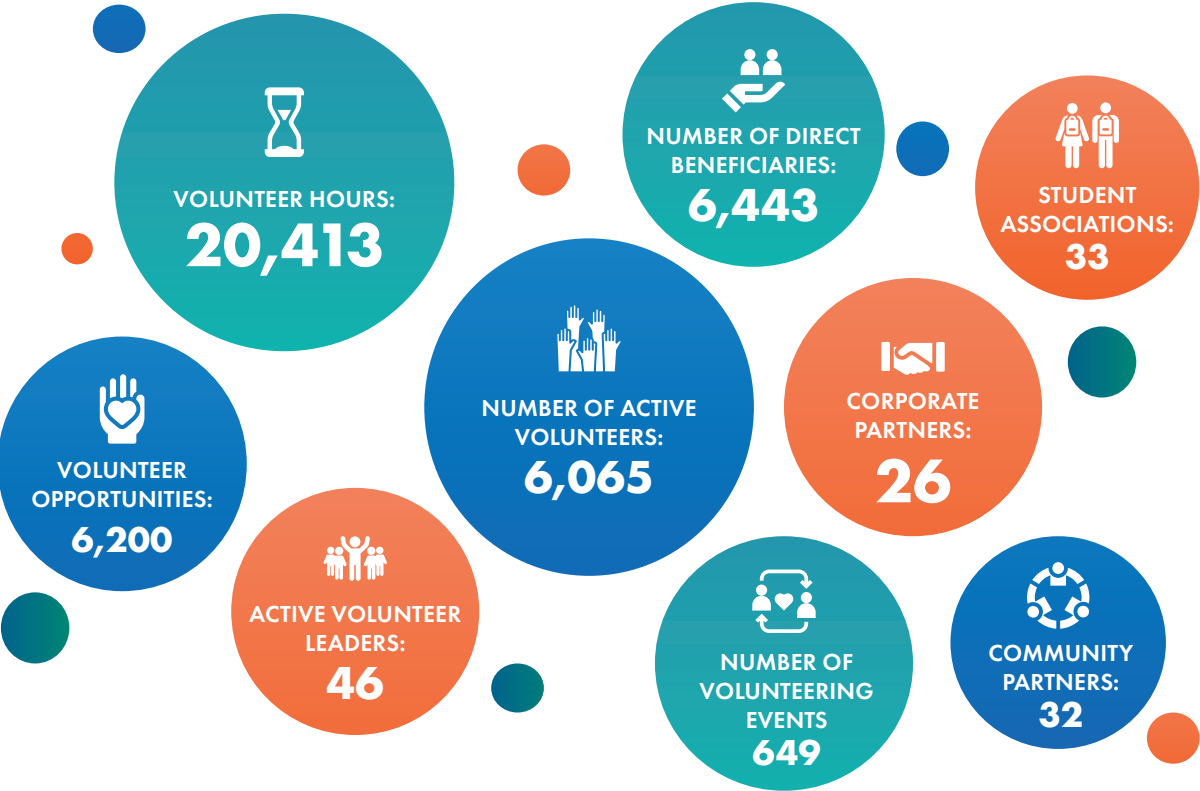

# Migrant Children Education Project

As the pace of urban development accelerates, a large number of migrant workers join the tide of construction in Shanghai. At the same time, the children of migrant workers follow their parents and come to Shanghai to study, work, and live. At present, there are more than 400,000 migrant children of school age in Shanghai. As the second-generation “immigrants” entering Shanghai and becoming the future “new Shanghainese”, they can receive compulsory education in specialized migrant schools here and gradually enter public schools to study and live with local students. In recent years, government support and social attention have greatly improved the school facilities and teachers of migrant children. To give these children more opportunities to explore and develop in their quality, abilities, and expertise, HandsOn Shanghai has been recruiting and organizing educational volunteers to come to migrant children’s schools since 2008. Our goal has been to improve the infrastructure and teaching environment for the school and provide a wealth of extracurricular activities for children.

In the rehabilitation center, children need intensive and continuous rehabilitation training every day, but in addition to physical and cognitive training, children also need to communicate with more people. Volunteers come to the rehabilitation center every week, and through the happy lunch class, children can sit and study together and spend time together in addition to the monotonous and repetitive training. Small games such as coloring can also allow children to develop their creativity and develop cognitively.

### HIGHLIGHT ACTIVITY 1

#### GRAFFITI

With the support of the Rainbow Mother Family Care Center, Xingqu Graffiti is the only regular program that remains after the epidemic has stabilized this year. The Xingqu Graffiti Class does not pursue perfect art, nor does it cultivate young painters, but volunteers. With our company's help, autistic children can be happy in the process of graffiti while learning and improving their life and social cognition. Autistic children are respected, and volunteers have the opportunity to understand this group.

#### SPECIAL EDUCATION SCHOOL INTEREST CLASS

HandsOn Shanghai has cooperated with Dong Li Feng Mei Kang Jian School since 2015 to supplement various interest classes for children. # Elderly Care Program —

## COMPANY

Generally speaking, the elderly has two types of needs: basic survival needs, such as accommodation, food, etc.; and personal spiritual needs, including humanistic care, psychological companionship, and integration with the community. Elderly care institutions have already met the basic survival needs of the elderly, but there is still a lot of room for improvement in terms of spiritual needs. The limitations of life in nursing homes often make the elderly feel lonely, socially helpless, and lacking in value. Taking into account these spiritual needs of the elderly, HandsOn Shanghai cooperated a number of nursing homes to carry out long-term volunteer service projects, including daily companionship and various manual activities suitable for the elderly. It not only brings joy to the elderly and enriches their lives, but also allows more people to approach this group.

In this special year, the nursing home has implemented a stricter management model. For the health of grandparents, volunteers are rarely able to visit and chat with them holding their hands as before. However, volunteers made anti-epidemic sachets and sent their blessings in the form of “Sachets of Love”. Send it to the elderly and accompany the elderly in another way.

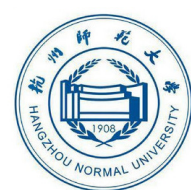
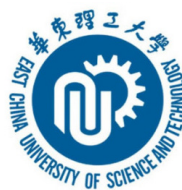
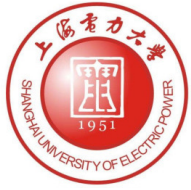
